The Master Mason should be a better citizen than the non-Mason because he has been better taught and has pledged his sacred Honor.



When new members are required, active Lodge members in the area affected are asked for recommendations, and the recommendations voted on by the current L&M board.

Since the L&M is a "Tax Exempt Private Operating Foundation," members are not con sidered from the current Building Board. This is intended to keep the L&M Foundation distinctly separate and "squeaky clean" and prevent any conflict of interest. The L&M is considered a renter, not an owner.
