# Library Notes ALICE BYRNES,

At the close of the annual Lodge installation on December 9th, Jim Byrnes requested to make a presentation. Jim remarked that in 1979 he had been appointed chairman of the construction committee to supervise a new Masonic Center following a fire destroying the previous building. He remarked that he had enjoyed watching the various improvements since the dedication of the building, the most recent was the renovation of the Lodge Room. To "put the frosting on the cake" Jim and Alice presented a new, up to date, Wisconsin Flag to the Northeast Wisconsin Masonic Center to honor Daylite, Des Peres, Roosevelt, and Washington Lodges.

A brief explanation was given on the various symbols that make up the flag. Since everyone on the mailing list for the NEW Masonic Center was not at the installation, it looked like a good topic to for the New Masonic Library/Museum to use as a part of the upcoming Trestle Board.

The Wisconsin flag was first designed in 1863 Several revisions have been made through the years to add new features – the most recent being made in **1981** when the word "Wisconsin" in capital letters, was placed above the Shield of Wisconsin and the year of statehood, 1848, centered below the Seal.

Centered on the Flag is the Wisconsin Coat of Arms, representing many of the state's natural resources and contributions of early pioneers for the state's development. In the center is a shield with four quadrants, each symbolizing a type of work that people did when the first flag was developed in 1863: plow; pick and shovel; arm and hammer; anchor. On one side of the shield stands a sailor while a minor stands on the other; at their feet can be found a cornucopia and a pyramid of iron ingots. In the center, representing Wisconsin's loyalty to the United States, is a small red, white and blue shield – part of the United States Coat of Arms.

The Northeast Wisconsin Masonic Library/Museum, Inc is a not for profit, private operating foundation, leasing space from the Northeast Wisconsin Masonic Center. One of the main requirements for this type of classification with the IRS is education. To fulfill this obligation, several programs have been developed for presentations to schools and organizations — both Masonic and non-Masonic. Among the programs is one on Historical Flags that have flown over our country since early colonial days. Fifteen flags with explanation are featured. Most recently one has been developed around the Military Flags: Army, Navy, Coast Guard, Marine and Air Force. The Merchant Marine Flag has been included - their ships carry troops, equipment and ammunition thereby supporting our Military.
