

A major mission of the Masonic Library Museum is education. To help accomplish this goal, and to keep the IRS happy, a discussion group is held on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 7:00. Topics are chosen from the Short Talks Bulletins published by the Masonic Services Association. These discussions are open and registration is not necessarv.

The Northeast Wisconsin Masonic Library museum is a tax exempt private operating foundation that makes an annual donation to the North East Wisconsin Masonic Center for the use of space dedicated to the Library/Museum. It was dedicated May 14, 1983 and has grown over those 33 years from a one room operation with 4 display cases and a wall of book shelves to two rooms. The museum features artifacts from various Masonic items from Wisconsin and a few out of the country. The library houses over 1600 volumes. Some are reference materials to be used in the library while others may be checked out and taken home to enjoy.
