





Library Notes

How many of you routinely wander past the library/museum display in the lobby of the North entrance to the building? How many of you check out the display to see what is being featured? Although, at the present time, the display contains only a few items, they are worth noting as they are among the oldest items in the museum.

There are two books, Masonic Monitors, that are fragile and handled only with white gloves. One of them is over two hundred years old, Yes, you are reading this correctly - over two hundred years old. Both of these books were gifts to the Museum several years ago.

Also in the display is a pitcher made in England with Masonic scenes on it and a blown glass flask from a New England state with Masonic emblems on it. Both of them were made in the early 1800's. When an appraisal was made on the pitcher, we were told to guard it carefully as items of that type "were as scarce as hen's teeth".

Also in the museum are two hand carved teak chairs that were donated by Des Peres Lodge. The workmanship on them is unique and worth noting.

The museum is for your enjoyment, study and appreciation. Please come and visit us.
