HAPPY ANNIVERSARY!

On 14 May 1983 the Northeast Wisconsin Masonic Library and Museum was officially dedicated and has been growing and operating for over 30 years.

The L&M was the brain child of members of the Green Bay Scottish Rite, and was intended to be a source of operating income to replace the business rental income lost downtown. In the last 30 years the L&M has contributed over \$600,000, and currently pays over \$26,000 annually to the Masonic Center for the spaces leased by the L&M.

The L&M is a "Tax exempt private operating Foundation" (Similar to a 501C3) and all donations are tax deductible. The L&M accepts Masonic items as direct donations or on loan. Some currently held items are over 200 years old.
