



DAYLITE LODGE NO. 360 Almost Never Go Dark



The most recent display in the north Lobby (flag pole entrance) features Shrine Fezzes. Several are old embroidered fezzes with no jewels and others are rather ornate with many jewels. A young boy of about 10 years of age was in the museum a couple of years ago and he questioned why some had jewels and others did not. I wonder how many older people would be that observant. Our answer was the embroidered fezzes were older ones in our collection.

Did you notice the white fez? Yes, that is a scimitar incorporated into the design. Members of the "Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America" wear the white fez. The LOSNA is not an auxiliary of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. It is a separate and distinct Order. The organization was formed in 1903 in Wheeling, WV. While there is not a LOSNA court in Wisconsin, there are members living within the state.
